Please ensure you are typing the credentials in rather than copying and pasting them as this can insert invisible spaces which invalidate the details. These should be entered under the 'access log in' and not the 'personal log in'. If you have any difficulties please test in another browser as some are known as having issues.

We are free to share these details with staff and pupils, but they must not be offered to anyone external to our school or posted on social media.

Would you like to join us in going on a bear hunt? We would like to set up a bear hunt around the village for children to spot when they are out for their daily exercise. Dulcie will give you a number and then you need to put a sign in your window, with a rainbow and the number you have been given. Next to your sign you place your bear or even bears! Children going for a walk round the village can then try and spot all the bears! We have set up number 1 at school to get the bear hunt started.

We have been asked by the government to remain open over the Easter holidays for the children of keyworkers – this includes being open on the Bank Holidays. To ensure that school staff get a break, we have joined together with Foxton and Petersfield Primary Schools and will be offering joint provision over this period. Mr Herd will be running a sports camp for keyworkers children from the three schools, based at Foxton Primary School. We have contacted parents who have indicated that they are keyworkers directly, to discuss whether they need to use this provision. However we are aware that family situations may change over the two week holiday period. If you are or become a keyworker and your family circumstances change over the Easter break so that you need to access childcare please email me (head@barrington.cambs.sch.uk) and I will be happy to help you.

Teachers will not be setting new home learning over the Easter break, however the extra work that has been put on the class pages for children who have finished their paper learning packs will be left on the website over the break so that you can access them if you have bored children to entertain. The information weekly challenges will also be left on the news tab so that you can access those to complete as a family.

Over the past week I have managed to phone every family from school and either spoken to parents and children or left a message. It has been lovely to speak to you all and to hear how you are all coping with this very strange situation. I will be checking my school email at least daily over the Easter break, so if you are finding something tricky PLEASE DO email me. I will be very happy to help in any way that I can. When we return from the Easter break I will start my phones calls again to check in with everyone – but please do contact me if there is anything you need in the meantime.
