Attendance Newsletter November 2019

Welcome to our first Attendance Newsletter. As you know, everybody at Barrington is committed to ensuring that each of our children gets the best possible start to life. One way we can do this is through ensuring regular school attendance. Evidence shows that children who attend school regularly are more successful, not only in school, but in all areas of life. We hope that you will continue to support us in improving our school attendance by making sure the children are here every day and learning.

Did You Know....? For every day of school missed by a pupil it will reduce their attendance by 0.5%. Ten whole days of school has been missed if your child has 95% attendance. Twenty whole days of school has been missed if a pupil's attendance is 90%. By the time a pupil is persistently absent (85% attendance) they have missed 6 weeks or half a term of schooling.

What does good attendance mean? Being in school for at least 96% of the time or 180 to 190 days

Term Time Holidays

It is the policy in Cambridgeshire not to authorise term time holidays. Your children only attend school for 190 days out of 365. This leaves 175 days for holidays. Please book your holidays during these 175 days of school holidays. If you do take your child on holiday during term time without authorisation, then you will be at risk of receiving a Fixed Term Penalty Notice.

Lateness

Did you know that being 15 minutes late each day is the same as missing two weeks of school over the year. The start of the school day is an important time for children to develop their social skills with their peers, as well as preparing them for their learning. All classes have early morning work for the children form 8.45 and we start teaching at 8.55am. Children who are late miss out on opportunities to consolidate vital skills such as spelling, reading, phonics and/or basic number work.

Illness

We know that illness is unavoidable and to be expected. However it is very important to inform the school on the first day of absence with the reason either by phone (01223 712273), by email (office@barrington.cambs.sch.uk) or in person at the school office. As parents ourselves, we are also aware that it can be difficult to judge whether a child is well enough for school first thing in the morning. Please rest assured that if you send them in and, later in the day they are not well enough to stay in school, then we will ring you. If you have kept them at home and later in the morning it appears that they are well enough to be in school, please do bring them it – it is better to miss part of a day than a whole one.
