Welcome to our summer term information letter. In this letter we hope to inform you about what your child will be covering this term and some ideas as to how you can help your child at home. The topics for this term are 'How Does Your Garden Grow?' and 'We Do Like to be Beside the Seaside!'

Literacy

- Non fiction information texts
- Pattern and Rhyme ', 'Commotion in the ocean' Big waves and little waves'
- Recounts
- Writing postcards
- Forming letters correctly
- Fiction story's by Eric Carle

At home you could:

- Look together at story and non fiction books
- Continue to practice phonic blends.
- Practice letter formation and writing in sentences.
- Reading Strategies: to use some expression when reading, ask questions about what they have been reading.
- Practice spellings by children writing the word in a sentence.

Mathematics

- To recite and write numbers to 100.
- To have quick recall of number bonds to ten i.e. 2 and 8 makes 10, 3 and 7
- makes ten etc.
- Find a half or quarter of a shape or object. Find half or quarter of a quantity.
- Tell the time to the hour and half hour.
- Recognise coins to £2 and begin to understand their value.
- Solving simple addition and subtraction problems using money.

At home you could

- Play board games
- Find numbers in the environment numbers on houses, cars etc.
- Find shapes around the home
- Solve problems What shape is this package? If I have 17 sweets how many more do I need to make 22?
- Play shops giving change

Knowledge and Understanding

- Trip to Hunstanton Sea Life Centre and beach
- Looking at plants and planting seeds and vegetables
- Bug hunts
- To know that green plants need light and water to grow.
- Identify local wild plant and trees
- Geography the seaside- What is the seaside like? How do we get there?
- Using the globe and maps to locate the coast and individual areas
- The seaside in the past.
- Use Beebots for simple instructions and build up to a more complicated algorithms.
- Celebrations and Special Times: What happens at a wedding and when a baby is born?

- Looking at the work of Kadinsky and Andy Goldsworthy
- Using the work of Eric Carle to inspire art
- Tissue paper collage butterflies
- Spiral sea shells making clay spirals
- Keeping a steady beat
- Singing and moving at the same time

Physical Development

- Catching and throwing a ball
- Team games
- Parachute games
- Athletics skills
- Sports day

Personal Social and Emotional Development

- Understanding Feelings To recognise what causes different feelings in themselves and others.
- Managing Feelings To recognise simple ways of making themselves feel better.
- Valuing Difference
