Staff Car Park

Harvest Saucers – Instructions

At harvest we like to decorate the church with saucers to say 'Thank you' for all God's gifts.

Instructions:-

To make a saucer:

- 1. Tape your child's name to the underside of the saucer/small tea plate.
- 2. Fill the saucer level with damp sand/fine gravel.
- 3. Working from the outside edge make a circle of leaves.
- 4. Continue making circles with large flower petals, small flowers, berries or any fruits and seeds from the garden or hedgerow until all the sand is covered. Younger children will probably need a parent or other adult to help them.

It would be lovely if **all the children** could bring in a decorated saucer (or small tea plate.)

Please take your NAMED saucers to church before school on the Friday morning.
